From Fr. Peter's Desk

5th Sunday of Lent



Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading on this Fifth Sunday of Lent, we hear the Prophet Ezekiel announcing to the people the covenant, which contains a four-fold promise to them: the graves of the dead will be opened; those who have died will be brought to life; the people in exile will be brought back to their land and the spirit of God will be given to them. The promise of the Lord God is affirmed in signs and in words, "I have promised and I will do it", says the Lord.

In St. Paul's letter he speaks of his theology of the body, using the word "flesh" as either meaning the physical body or that part of human nature that is prone to sinfulness, as in the ways of the flesh. In today's reading, St. Paul denounces the way of the flesh, though he does not give examples as he does in other cases. It is the Spirit of Christ that overcomes the flesh and brings a new way of life to those who believe in him.

Our Gospel story is the raising of Lazarus and it draws us into the human grief of a family and of Jesus himself. This Gospel story is also our story, the story of death and the resulting grief that we all go through when we lose a loved one. But Jesus affirms that those who believe in Him will also rise to new life; death will not destroy the bonds of the relationship between Jesus and those he loves. This message brought comfort to Martha and Mary and is meant to bring comfort to us as well.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, this Fifth Sunday of Lent can be seen as a turning point in the Lenten journey as we enter the final days of this liturgical time, with less than two weeks left before we begin the Sacred Paschal Triduum.

As we reflect on our readings today, let us not forget where our Lenten journey leads us. From death to everlasting life. Jesus leads the way, all we have to do is believe and follow. Let the words of Jesus, "Be not afraid, I go before you always" ring loudly in our hearts as we are drawn closer to his Passion, Death and Resurrection.
