BAPTISMS:

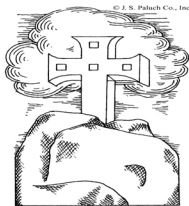
Baptisms are celebrated the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month. Parents are required to attend two preparation meetings. Please call the Parish Office for an appointment.

THE THEME

Dear Parish Family:



In our First Reading today, we hear of the transfer of authority as Shebna is removed from his high post, master of the palace, and a new leader, Eliakim, put in his place. We are reminded by this passage that God is the giver of authority.

Our Second Reading is a wonderful meditation on the mystery of God, concluding with the sequence of readings we have heard about the Jewish people. God's ways are beyond our understanding. We can only wonder and trust in the wisdom of God.

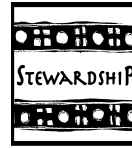
In our First Reading, God chose Eliakim as a leader for His people. In our Gospel of today, Jesus chooses Peter. Peter is chosen because he has learned to listen to the voice of God—for it is through God that Peter is able to recognize Jesus as the Christ. Peter is called the “rock” but the strength of the church built upon him does not come from him but rather from God.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we are called Christian because we choose to follow Jesus. We need to reflect on the same question that Jesus poses in today's Gospel: “Who do you say that I am?” The answer that we give will tell us much about who we need to be in this world. If we identify ourselves by the name of Christ, then we need to pray for the grace to live up to that name.
