From Fr. Peter's Desk

First Sunday of Advent

Dear Parish Family:



Our First Reading of today, as we enter into Advent, is the Prophet Isaiah's prayer of lamentation, the cry of the people who believe that God has abandoned them in their distress. The tone of the lament appears to blame God who has allowed them to wander from the ways of God. But God's anger may be justified because the people have been sinful. The passage ends with a statement of hope, "O Lord, you are our father. . . We are the work of your hands". In our Second Reading, we hear St. Paul greeting the people of Corinth with a typical salutation of grace and peace. He gives thanks to God for the many gifts bestowed on them, reminds them that their good fortune is rooted in the grace of God. The end of this passage has an Advent tone; he reminds them that it is the Lord who will keep them faithful until "the end". St. Mark's Gospel account sets the tone for our Advent spirituality. "Be watchful! Be alert!". Just as the servants are to take care of the master's possessions until his return, so too are the Lord's disciples, which we claim to be part of, take care of the gifts entrusted to them by God. Neither the servant nor the disciple knows when the master will return. My brothers and sisters in Christ, as we begin the season of Advent, we hear in our readings about waiting. From the Chosen People in exile to the disciples of Jesus, God reminds us to be on the watch. We are called upon this Advent season to prepare for the day when we celebrate God becoming flesh, becoming Incarnate, becoming one of us. As we wait in anticipation, we are called upon to prepare our hearts for Christ's presence in our lives and to make it our goal to reveal Christ to those we encounter. Today is a good day to begin to think of how we can make Christ's presence incarnate in what we say and do.
