From Fr. Peter's Desk
5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:



As we enter into the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary time, the Prophet Isaiah, in our First Reading, recalls that the expectations of the covenant were two-fold. First, the people were called to fidelity to God and second they were to care for their fellow members of the covenant community. These two expectations deal with the most basic and obvious of human needs: having food, shelter and clothing. Those who are in need are to be treated as your own, they are family. What a message in these times!

St. Paul, in our Second Reading, distances himself from the high wisdom teachings of other orators. He humbly admits to his own weakness and anxiousness in their presence, but he boldly affirms that the message of Christ Jesus is what is really important.

Our Gospel message uses metaphors of salt and light, both cause other things to happen. Salt adds flavor to food; light gets rid of darkness. The task of the disciple is to be an agent of the Kingdom of God so that the lives of others will be enriched.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, our readings today draw us to the expectations that God has for each one of His children. Any loving parent wants to see their children live a good, holy life and God is no exception. Both Isaiah and Jesus remind us of what living a holy life is all about; loving God by serving others. In our Gospel, Jesus does not say "you can be the light of the World," He says "you are the light of the World". Jesus is telling us to proclaim the Kingdom of God today, now, during our lifetime. Are we up to the mission in which we were baptized for?

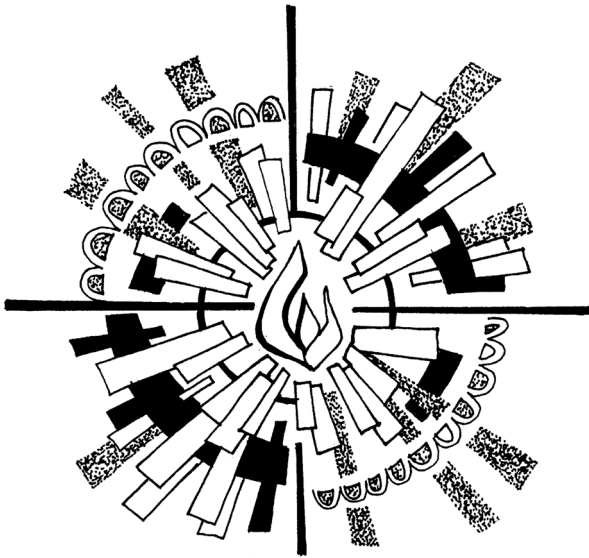
Long Island/Metro Retrouvaille
