#### **BAPTISMS:**

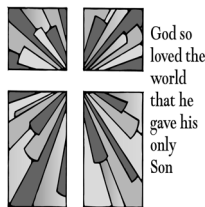
Baptisms are celebrated the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month. Parents are required to attend two preparation meetings. Please call the Parish Office for an appointment.

**From Fr. Peter's Desk**  
*The Most Holy Trinity*



**Dear Parish Family:**

As we leave our Easter Season and enter into Ordinary Time on the liturgical calendar, we celebrate today the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, commemorating the central dogma of Christianity: the triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Our First Reading for this Solemnity brings us back to Moses begging to see the glory of God, and how God grants his request. On Mount Sinai, God proclaims his name, and lets Moses glimpse his glory as he passes by. God cries out that He is "merciful and gracious. . . Slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity". What comfort that is for us.

St. Paul's simple words to the Corinthians, in our Second Reading comes in sharp contrast to the splendid imagery of the First Reading. Paul reminds the Corinthians that part of mending their ways is to encourage one another, agree with each other and live in peace. His parting blessing refers to the trinity and that God was, is and will be the source of the peace and unity that Paul envisions. Our Gospel introduces us to the same loving God that Moses encountered on Mount Sinai in our first reading. God's will is always for our life and salvation, and Jesus comes to be savior, not judge.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, our readings today remind us that the triune God is ever present in our lives, as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God sent his Son so that the World "might be saved through him" God the creator is sharing himself with us through his Son, Jesus Christ. The advocate, the Holy Spirit, seals this covenantal relationship. Let us give thanks to God for his generosity and love by living our lives in worthiness of His kindness and mercy.
