BAPTISMS:

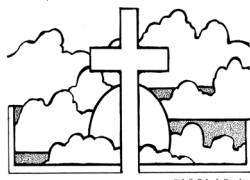
Baptisms are celebrated the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month. Parents are required to attend two preparation meetings. Please call the Parish Office for an appointment.

From Fr. Peter's Desk
7th Sunday of Easter



Dear Parish Family:

Our First Reading today follows the Apostles return to Jerusalem after our Lord's Ascension. They waited in prayer for the promised Advocate, with others who include Mary and some of Jesus' relatives. The names of the eleven are important as they correspond to the list of Apostles named by Luke in his account of the Gospel (minus Judas). The order has been changed, however, presumably to note the importance or leadership of some in the group.

In our Second Reading, we hear that sharing in the sufferings of Christ as a result of Christian living and action is to be a cause for joy. In carrying our crosses in life, we can rely on the Spirit who rests upon those who are blessed through such suffering. We are called not to be ashamed of suffering that results from our Christianity. Not easy but we are never left alone. Our Gospel tells of a beautiful prayer of Jesus to his heavenly father whereby he focuses on his union with the father, the disciple's union with the father through him, and the true meaning of eternal life: knowing the only true God and the one whom he sent, Jesus Christ. He prays for all who belong to him—those who keep his words, accept them, understand their origin with the Father, and believe that Jesus has been sent by the Father.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, living the Christian life can often come with joy as well as sorrow. But our responsorial psalm reminds us that we have no reason to fear, the Lord is with us and although we cannot always explain what happens to us in life, we know that our loving God is walking beside us in our journey. Let this knowledge be of comfort to us and strengthen us in our times of difficulty.
