MARRIAGES:

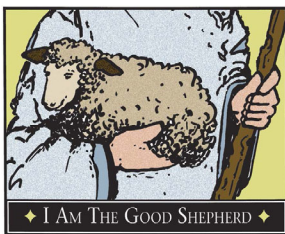
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk Fourth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

Our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles reminds us that Jesus is the cornerstone of our faith, for his life, death and resurrection provide its foundation. We too are called to make Him the cornerstone of our lives so that we may be living temples of the Lord, embodying his message and the mission he left us.

St. John, in our Second Reading, tells us that we are God's children, formed by God, made in God's image, cared for by God and influenced by our understanding of God. Jesus, as God's Son, has given us a model of how to live as a child of God.
