## From Fr. Peter's Desk Fifth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we catch a glimpse of St. Paul (still called Saul) at a unique time. Just recently converted, he is intent on speaking boldly in Jesus' name. St. John tells us (in our second reading) that believing in Jesus' name and loving one another are the ways to remain in him.

Both readings remind us that we are the branches of the vine that is the Lord. Our Gospel continues the theme of vine and branches. Jesus is the vine, and we make up the branches. We are connected to each other, like the branches of a vine. All of us are connected to Jesus as the vine itself. As does the vine to its branches, Jesus gives us support and sustenance, enabling us to bear good fruit.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the vine is a living thing, designed to grow and develop. We help the vine do this when we put our faith into practice, when we sacrifice ourselves for the least of our sisters and brothers, for they too are connected to the vine. In doing so, we nurture the vine and, as Jesus told his disciples, we glorify God.

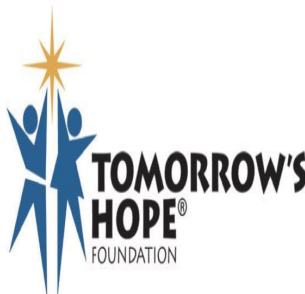

The St. Agnes Music Department will continue the tradition of presenting great sacred classical music masterworks with the performance of these two gems, composed for choir, orchestra, and soloists. Vivaldi's setting of the Gloria takes on the form of an extended cantata, where the various parts of the text are given a separate movement. Vivaldi composed this setting of the Gloria text when working at the famous orphanage turned music school: the Ospedale della Pieta in Venice, Italy.

Bach's setting of the Magnificat takes a similar format of dividing up the texts for the purposes of creating individual movements. Bach was newly appointed to the St. Thomas Church (Thomaskirche), Leipzig, Germany, when the 1st performance took place in 1723, 300 years ago this past year! The orchestration is a delight to hear, as are the choral and vocal solo parts. The challenging Baroque music is further decorated by the use of five-part singing of the Choir (SSATB)!
