From Fr. Peter's Desk Second Sunday of Easter

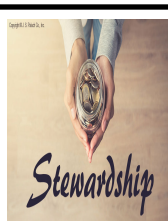
Dear Parish Family:

Our First and Second Readings today, both from the New Testament, provide beautiful pictures of the post-Easter community. Among themselves, the disciples share their possessions. Nevertheless, they are not an in-grown community that ignores the rest of the world. They testify to Jesus' resurrection because their faith in Jesus and in life is more powerful than all the powers of the world.

Today's Gospel reading gives us much more to consider besides the question of doubt. Even though Jesus has appeared to the Apostles twice since His resurrection, they are still afraid. Are they afraid that they will suffer what Jesus suffered? Although these two resurrection appearances emphasize the wounds he suffered from the Roman Empire, they simultaneously announce that resurrection faith is about believing in life even when traumatic deaths and losses surround us.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, still basking in the glory of Easter, today we celebrate God's unparalleled mercy. Divine Mercy Sunday, the second Sunday of Easter, reminds us that out of mercy for all of us, Jesus died on the cross, atoning for our sins, past, present and future. This Easter season, let us rejoice, for the risen Lord is in our midst, forever bestowing God's divine mercy upon us.

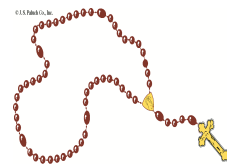
