From Fr. Peter's Desk Sixth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

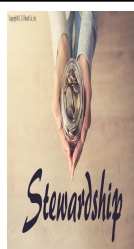
In our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, it is emphasized that we have a model of abiding love in Jesus. We are loved by Him as He is loved by God, and we should obey His commands as He obeys God's commands. With Jesus as an example, we learn that obedience out of an abiding love brings joy.

Our Second Reading from 1Jn. Explains what this singular love commandment means. Love is a conscious decision to act. It involves the willingness to die for one's friends. What is being asked of us is again based on God's and Jesus' example.

The Gospel reading from John contains a sentence that is stated twice: the command that we love one another. Jesus made us his friends on his own initiative. He chooses, appoints, and calls us to be his friends by opening himself up and sharing what he knows with us. It is now up to us to give this gift of love and friendship by giving of ourselves without limiting "friends" to other followers of Jesus.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus tells us to love one another, but as we all know, that can often be very difficult. By loving others, we imitate God, who first loved us, and we invite others to become more loving people too. Let us pray for the strength to love, not just love those who love us but to love those who make it difficult to love them. Let us always keep in mind the words of our lord, "love one another as I have loved you."
