## From Fr. Peter's Desk Palm Sunday

Dear Parish Family:

Our Mass today starts with the Reading of the Gospel. We learn in our opening Gospel that Pharisees reacted strongly to Jesus' disciples publicly and loudly acclaiming Jesus as "king" as they approached Jerusalem. They fear the Roman Authorities would assume an uprising was imminent. But Jesus did not enter the city riding on a steed or war-horse, as a conqueror or military hero would. His entrance was meek, riding on a colt, the foal of an ass.

Our reading from Isaiah speaks of a servant who is obedient to God's calling. Thus, the description of abuse and suffering stems from the servant's fidelity to his mission yet there is true conviction that God will save his servant.

Our Second Reading from St. Paul relates how Jesus, although divine, emptied Himself and chose a life of humility and suffering to save humanity. Jesus' self-emptying was done as a gift to the Father and results in his glorification and a sharing of freedom in the face of betrayal, lynching, and an indifferent police state. When He offered up His will in the garden, proclaimed to the high priest that he was the Son of Man, or asked God to forgive His murderers, He freely chose what was right. His choice to do so made this use of His freedom an example to the whole human race.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, we begin the holiest season of the year by holding palm branches in our hands, which recall the palm branches the crowds used two thousand years ago to welcome the Lord into the holy city. We anticipate Jesus' ultimate victory while recognizing the intense suffering and profound grief that will accompany it. Walk with us along the road to Calvary and ultimately, to the resurrection.




