Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. From Fr. Peter's Desk
Second Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

Our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, speaks of the many who came to believe that Jesus was Lord simply because of the merciful deeds done in his name. The story of Thomas in this week's Gospel reading probably speaks to the experience of even more individuals. They believed entirely through faith in the Gospel.

John's Revelation, which we hear in our Second Reading, contains a type of vision which includes symbolic imagery that emphasizes that the exalted Christ is truly present. He speaks with a voice like a trumpet, He is surrounded with gold lampstands; he wears white and gold garments, like descriptions of the divine in Israelite tradition. These phenomena convince the author John that he is somehow beholding the risen Christ in his vision.

John the evangelist wrote for disciples who did not have firsthand knowledge of Jesus. Over time, those with firsthand memories of Jesus died and were succeeded in the faith by people too young to remember Jesus. In his resurrection accounts, John helped his community understand the mysteries of our faith by showing the power of faith.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, as we end the octave of Easter, we contemplate the mystery of the resurrection in the light of God's infinite mercy. The richness of God's mercy radiates through today's Scriptures. Let us share the love and mercy that our God has shown us with all of our brothers and sisters!


lowed by the Rosary and Chaplet. Also on Saturdays at 9:30AM we meet to pray the Rosary. All are welcome.


