MARRIAGES:


Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk Seventh Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

Our First Reading is from the Acts of the Apostles, and it tells of the first Christian martyr, St. Stephen, whose faith was so strong that he was willing to give his life rather than remain silent. Stephen bears witness to his faith and pays with his life. Ironically, the one who oversees Stephen's murder is Saul, who we know was St. Paul. Once confronted by Jesus, he spends the rest of his life bearing witness on behalf of the Lord.

We hear, in the reading from Revelation, that the risen Jesus is the bright morning star. Jesus is the dawn of God who is thirsty. The reading concludes with the final words of Scripture, the longing and hopeful cry of the Church for the Lord Jesus to come again.

In our Gospel today, Jesus concludes His high priestly prayer to the Father by praying that his disciples and all those who will believe in Him in the future may have a share of the love He and the Father have for each other. In this Holy Trinity, which includes the Holy Spirit, we can see a mode of unity, a goal for Christian denominations. One in Christ.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, as Jesus is one with God, so we must be one with God and with one another. This relationship-with God and each other-is the Church, which exists not for its own sake, but for the sake of the world. It is up to us to form and continue relationships that heal and serve.


