From Fr. Peter's Desk Fifth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading, Paul and Barnabas are on the move. They remind the other disciples that the road of the Gospel is a long and hard one. Just as Jesus suffered, so will his followers.

In St. John's Book of Revelation, our Second Reading today, we see a glimpse of God's kingdom in all its glory: a new heaven and a new earth in which the suffering that Paul understood was necessary has finally ceased forever. In the new creation, God makes a home with human beings, and they dwell together in peace.

The reading from today's Gospel of John reminds these early Christians that they should be marked by love. How are we seen as followers of Christ. We will be known by the way that we love one another. It was no easy task back when Jesus walked the earth and it remains difficult today for Christians divided by other kinds of difference.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus speaks to an intimate group in the most intimate of terms. The commandment he gives is new because the love He is speaking about is new, all consuming, and sacrificial. The term we use today "tough love" is nothing compared to the sacrificial love Jesus gives us through his sacrificial life and death. Our call to love one another can often seem too difficult but with God's grace, we do the best that we can to lead our life with a selfless devotion in our dealing with others.

The Rosary Group




