**From Fr. Peter’s Desk**  
**Sixth Sunday of Easter**

Dear Parish Family:

Acts 15, our first reading of today, records the first official gathering of the young Church: the Jerusalem council. They debate whether Gentiles should be circumcised when they convert to Christianity, or in essence, to become Jews. The reading omits vs 3-21, when Barnabas, Paul and James argued that both Gentiles and Jews will be saved through God’s grace.

The reading from Revelation reminds us that God’s promises to Israel remain at the heart of the Gospel, since Jerusalem and the twelve tribes of Israel are woven into the new creation along with the twelve apostles.

In our Gospel reading, Jesus’ promises to His disciples have been fulfilled: God and the Lamb have indeed come and made their dwelling with God’s people: just as He promised. Jesus returns to be with His followers forever.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus gives to his disciples and to us two gifts, one of His peace and the other, the Holy Spirit, that is the Paraclete. It is through the Holy Spirit that the redemptive work of the paschal mystery is open for our participation. Let us give thanks for the peace of Christ and the Holy Spirit, two incomparable gifts which nearly two thousand years later continue to be as present to us as they were to the disciples over two thousand year ago.




