## From Fr. Peter's Desk Third Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

In this Sunday's First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the exaltation of Christ is shown to us. The first effect is the bold speech with which the apostles address their captors, proclaiming the Gospel to them as a defense. Throughout the New Testament, bold speech is a sign that Christ is at work in someone.

In our Second reading, the author of Revelation describes heavenly worship. All the heavenly beings as well as all of the human family, fall down to worship the Lamb of God.

Our Gospel reading shows us the ability of Jesus to surprise people with his unexpected presence. The hall mark of these visits was a statement of love, such as the one he shared with Simon Peter. For John the evangelist, a critical aspect of discipleship was the search for signs of the exalted Christ still at work among his people.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the Church gives us fifty days to contemplate how the Lord draws us close, feed us and empowers us to be living witnesses of joy. It is up to us to seek out opportunities to share this love and joy with others.


lowed by the Rosary and Chaplet. Also on Saturdays at 9:30AM we meet to pray the Rosary. All are welcome.

Suffolk County Police will discuss how to respond appropriately to concerning statements about schools posted on social media, along with the potential consequences of making such posts. The session will also address what steps to take if you or your child sees or receives these types of comments online. An overview of the Suffolk County Police Department's investigation procedures will be provided.
