14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah, the Lord calls the people to rejoice and be glad along with Jerusalem. The Israelites had mourned over their beautiful city when she was dishonored and destroyed by the Babylonian empire. Now the healed and rebuilt city will be like a mother to them, offering them comfort and delight.

In our Second Reading from St. Paul, the apostle declares that he will never boast in anything except the cross of Jesus. For Paul, the world has been remade because of the death and resurrection of Jesus, and that is the only thing that matters to him.

In today's Gospel reading, the seventy-two disciples who had been sent out ahead of Jesus, proclaiming God's kingdom and paving the way of Jesus' ministry, return to Him rejoicing. Although the apostles were rejoicing over their authority of evil spirits, Jesus instructs them to rejoice that their names are written in heaven!

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Joy, abundance, freedom, peace: How deeply God longs to pour out His gifts on us and fulfill our deepest yearnings. This fulfillment comes to us through Jesus and, like the seventy-two whom He sends on mission, we are meant to carry it to others. Let us pray for each other to have the courage to fulfill our mission here on earth.


The Rosary Group



Stop Physician-Assisted Suicide in New York

New York is on the brink of legalizing physician-assisted suicide. Bill A136 has already passed the Senate and Assembly. **The only thing standing in its way is Governor Hochul's veto – and she needs to hear from you.**
