

**From Fr. Peter’s Desk
Saints Peter and Paul**

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter emerges as a confident leader and eloquent preacher, in contrast the often-impulsive figure of the Gospel accounts. Peter, whose name means “rock” is the firm foundation upon whom Christ will build His church.

In his Second Letter to Timothy, the apostle Paul contemplates the end of his life with a sense of peaceful fulfillment. He has faithfully finished the race that God gave him to run. Now he looks forward with hope to his reward: eternal life with God.

Matthew 16 (our Gospel reading today) recounts a turning point for Peter. The disciples tell Jesus that the people are unsure of His identity. Peter, however, replies, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” Our readings today show Peter at the highpoint of his ministry.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, as role models, Sts. Peter and Paul both have their weak points. Yet despite their weaknesses, both were chosen and sent. Their weakness makes them suited to encourage and empower us. Weak as we are, with faith all of us may be evangelizers and defenders of the Church.

New York is on the brink of legalizing physician-assisted suicide. Bill A136 has already passed the Senate and Assembly. **The only thing standing in its way is Governor Hochul's veto – and she needs to hear from you.**
