THE THEME

Figuring out how to live in faith can sometimes create a confusion of copious rules, regulations, practices and prohibitions. The reality, however, is a rather simple “heart and soul” thing. Loving and responding to God can not happen apart from loving one’s neighbor with deep compassion. Today’s Gospel reminds us that the neighbor might not be the one we would choose to love. The good Samaritan story is a cautionary tale that catches our attention for good reason.

From Fr. Peter's Desk 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Do this, Moses says in our First Reading, entreating the people to keep God's commandments, and you will live. In God's mercy and great kindness, God will hear those who call on Him for help.

St. Paul writes, in his letter to the Colossians, why Jesus has the authority to interpret God's laws. Paul writes that Jesus was "before all things", and in Him "all things hold together". He is the firstborn of the dead, meaning that He has resurrected into new life, where all the faithful will one day follow Him.

When a scholar of God's law (the Torah) asks Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life, Jesus turns the question back on him. Jesus tells the scholar that he already knows the answer, its already in his mouth and heart. Love God and neighbor. Jesus goes on to tell his most famous parable, gently showing the scholar that he does not need to wonder who his neighbor is; he only needs to behave as a neighbor by showing God's mercy to those in need.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the good Samaritan illustrates whom we are called to love (everyone, regardless of affiliation or identity), and how we are called to love them (actively, in a way that responds to their need). The question for us then is not who is my neighbor, but rather to whom can I be a neighbor?

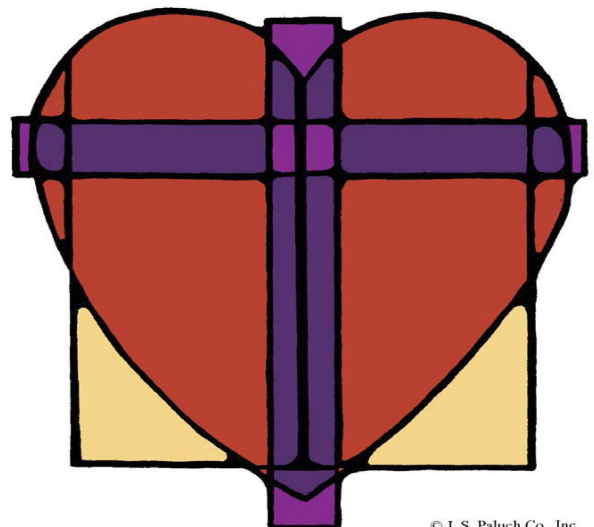
The Rosary Group

Sponsor a Child Program in India

There are a number of children who do not go to school through no fault of their own because their parents cannot afford to send them to school. It costs \$10.00 a month for a child to go to school. This enables us to provide books, clothing and, in some situations, we also provide food. The Pallottine priests who work in the missions in India will oversee this program.

With a sacrifice of \$10 a month, you can help a very needy child to go to school. Your help does build hope in the life of the child for a better future and the whole family is very grateful to you.

Huts to Home Program

The Pallottines in India are also involved in building houses for the people who don't have a house or are living in thatched huts. It costs \$3,000.00 to build a house which will have a bedroom, living room, kitchen and a bathroom.

For the families who receive these houses, it is a dream coming true. Houses can be built in honor of a dear one or in memory of a dear one who has passed away and we will place a plaque in the house and the family will always remember you and your loved ones in their prayers. Once the house is built, you will receive a picture of the house along with the family who receives it.

Stop Physician-Assisted Suicide in New York

New York is on the brink of legalizing physician-assisted suicide. Bill A136 has already passed the Senate and Assembly. **The only thing standing in its way is Governor Hochul's veto — and she needs to hear from you.**
