From Fr. Peter's Desk
16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from Genesis, the Lord appears to Abraham in the form of three strangers. While Jewish rabbis typically understood the men as angels, Christian interpreters beginning with Augustine, viewed them as the Trinity.

In our Second Reading, St. Paul believes that Jesus is the one thing that truly matters. Paul writes this Letter to the Colossians from prison. Perhaps he is reflecting on his death when he writes that in his flesh he is "filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ". Paul repeats the words mystery and glory: What a mystery! What glory awaits!

In our Gospel, Mary sits at Jesus' feet in the posture of a disciple at the feet of her rabbi. Martha is upset that Mary is shirking the duties of hospitality, leaving her to do all the work. But Jesus affirms that Mary has chosen the better part, the one thing that matters-listening to Jesus.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, when confronted with the living God, Abraham and his daughter in faith, Mary, react in the same way, with a response that is itself living, flexible, and openhearted. Our Gospel today tells us that Jesus is saying to his disciples that what he needs from them is not busyness over good works or anxiety about externals but that relationship with God is an intimacy that goes beyond formalities. Let us pray that we do not become too distracted by externals to be able to recognize and welcome God into each aspect of our daily lives.

Sponsor a Child Program in India

There are a number of children who do not go to school through no fault of their own because their parents cannot afford to send them to school. It costs \$10.00 a month for a child to go to school. This enables us to provide books, clothing and, in some situations, we also provide food. The Pallottine priests who work in the missions in India will oversee this program.

With a sacrifice of \$10 a month, you can help a very needy child to go to school. Your help does build hope in the life of the child for a better future and the whole family is very grateful to you.

Huts to Home Program

The Pallottines in India are also involved in building houses for the people who don't have a house or are living in thatched huts. It costs \$3,000.00 to build a house which will have a bedroom, living room, kitchen and a bathroom.

For the families who receive these houses, it is a dream coming true. Houses can be built in honor of a dear one or in memory of a dear one who has passed away and we will place a plaque in the house and the family will always remember you and your loved ones in their prayers. Once the house is built, you will receive a picture of the house along with the family who receives it.
