MARRIAGES:


Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In our Second Reading from the Hebrews, faith is described as the assurance or confidence of what is hoped for. This same faith allowed Abraham's descendants, generations later, to have courage as they awaited God's deliverance from their enslavement in Egypt (Wisdom 18:6). God delivered them from death (in the Exodus) and preserved them despite famine.

We hear, in the Letter to the Hebrews, that we tend to conflate faith with belief. The word that Hebrews uses for faith (Pistis) can mean belief, but it can also indicate faithfulness or trust. The faith of Hebrews 11 is an active trust that launched Abraham away from home to a place yet unknown. Abraham's confident hope laid the foundation upon which God built the covenant with Israel.

When Jesus instructs his disciples about waiting for His return, He shows them that waiting is not passive inaction. Waiting faithfully means being ready at any hour; it means acting in accord with the master's will.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, God has given us much and He will demand much of us in return. When called to account, we cannot plead ignorance or claim privilege. Members of the Body of Christ are called to live as though their work is the master's and should not be delayed. 
