MARRIAGES:


Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

There is a common thread running through today's readings: the gathering of all the nations to God's table. In our First Reading from Isaiah, the lord tells the prophet that he comes to gather nations of every language to Jerusalem, where they will behold God's glory. The nations will see and proclaim God's glory.

The author of Hebrews writes to Christians who wonder if striving to enter is worth their suffering or if they should give up and turn back. The author again narrates their trials, their persecution, as a form of God's love, to encourage them not to give up.

In the Gospel reading of today, Jesus declares that people will come from the four corners of the earth, from nations all over the world, to sit at God's table. Jesus also warns them that some will try to enter but will not be able. Some who think they are first in line will find themselves last.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, when it comes to salvation, we may feel confident about our odds. By virtue of our baptism, surely, we are the saved. Jesus is warning us not to be complacent-there will be "people". . . From the east and west, the north and south" at God's table whom we least expect to see there. Let us therefore pray not for only ourselves, but for all who strive to live a good life, in order that all of our rewards will be great in heaven.
