**From Fr. Peter’s Desk  
26th Sunday In Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:

The idle rich of Zion are so complacent and self-absorbed that they likely do not realize whom they are hurting. They never see them. Amos says they anoint themselves with fine oils, oils that could be sold and given to the poor. As was said of Nero, they play music for themselves as the nation collapses. Their indifference to those in need is an abomination to Amos and the Lord.

St. Paul, in our Second Reading, reminds Timothy to “pursue righteousness”. Part of pursuing God’s righteousness is to love those whom God favors, as in the psalm: all those who are most vulnerable or marginal in society, as represented by the trio of the stranger, the foreigner or migrant, the widow and the fatherless (Psalm 146:8-9).

The rich man in our Gospel parable is condemned for the same reason as the rich in our First reading from Amos. He feasts while Lazarus hungers; he enjoys a luxurious lifestyle even while he walks past Lazarus begging for food at his gate every day. “Blessed are the hungry, for they will be filled; but woe to the complacent rich, for they have already received their consolation in this life and can expect none in the next” (Luke 6:20-21, 24-25)

My brothers and sisters in Christ, both Amos and Jesus do not condemn someone for having money but rather what they do with that money. Do they serve only themselves or those in need? This is a parable not just for the rich, but for all of us who are able to reach out to those in need, if not with money, then in good gestures and kind words. God reminds us today that the unhoused person suffering at our feet is intimately known to and cherished by God; and that faith is not enough to secure the kingdom. We have a choice to make in order to be faithful followers of Jesus.
