From Fr. Peter's Desk

All Soul's Day

Dear Parish Family:

In our First reading from Wisdom, the foolish do not understand the nature of death. The foolish think that the death of the righteous means that they are no more. Perhaps their death is even a sign of their failure or God's displeasure. But God holds the righteous in his hands and never lets them go.

Our Second reading tells us that God's love for us is so great that He dies for us even though we do not deserve it. Paradoxically, it is God's love that protects us from God's righteous anger at our entanglement in sin and injustice. God's justice demands a payment, but God in his love pays it for us.

Our Gospel reading reminds us of this unshakable love. It is the Father's will that the Son does not lose any of the ones entrusted to him. The Son holds them firm in His grasp, and will not let them go, and will raise them up on the last day.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the Old Testament reading for today offers a most beautiful metaphor for the souls of the dead: "They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead: but they are in peace, they shall shine and shall dart about as sparks through stubble and the faithful shall abide with Him in love. Though we trust in this vision, the Church teaches us to pray for the dead and acknowledge our ongoing communion with them. Let us pray for all of our deceased loved ones and all who have died in Christ. May they rest in the eternal embrace of our loving God.
