**From Fr. Peter's Desk**  
**28th Sunday In Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading, Naaman, the non-Israelite who was healed in Second Kings, is a commander in the army of the king of Aram. He learns of the healing powers of the prophet Elisha from an Israelite girl who had been taken captive by Aramean raiders. Naaman follows the instructions of Elisha and is healed, confessing "there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel". He tries to give Elisha a gift but the prophet refuses. God's healing is freely offered, even to this enemy of Israel; it is not for sale.

St. Paul, while in chains in prison, writes to Timothy, "But the word of God is not chained". The word of God goes out with power to God's people Israel and to all the nations. This second reading of today concludes with a strong word of hope: even when we are unfaithful, God remains faithful.

In the Gospel, Jesus heals ten people of leprosy, which is the same illness that afflicted Naaman. The only one who returns to thank Jesus is a Samaritan. God reveals his saving power again to "the nations." Like Naaman, the Samaritan is another foreigner from a people sometimes at odds with God's people Israel.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the leper is healed by Jesus but saved by his recognition of God's action. Our faith cannot be inert, we cannot passively accept the abundant gifts God has given us as simply our due. Instead, we should seek every opportunity to return to the source of our blessings, to give God thanks and also, because with each act of recognition, we affirm our faith and properly orient ourselves to the source of those blessings.
