MARRIAGES:


Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk
29th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading today, when the Amalekites attack Israel, the Israelites prevail as long as Moses keeps his arms raised. His upraised arms draw attention to the God who is giving them this victory. As today's psalm says, "My help is from the Lord". When St. Paul writes his Second Letter to Timothy, reminding his younger coworker in the Gospel about the power of the sacred Scriptures to give wisdom, he refers to the Hebrew Scriptures, the Old Testament. These were the scriptures of St. Paul and the first Christians, while the book later known as the New Testament was still being written.

Paul reminds us that one of the goals of reading Scripture is to make us wise and competent, equipped for all kinds of good works in the world.

Our Gospel reading has Jesus telling his disciples a parable for times when they might wonder whether God has stopped guarding them or even stopped listening to them at all. The lesson of this parable is given before the parable even begins: to keep praying and not to lose heart.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, in our Gospel we learn much about prayer. Christian prayer is humble and constant. The widow in the parable is elderly, and she has learned about the rewards of a life of patient prayer and hope. We too must be patient and constant in our prayer life. God is listening and will answer in His time and in His way. God loves His people and will bring justice to those who cry out to Him!
