From Fr. Peter's Desk 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

Our First Reading from Malachi, sets the mood for today's readings in a matter of seconds, warning that the day of judgment is coming, when the world will be reduced to stubble and God will show no mercy to the wicket. The images that Malachi envisions regarding the end of the world are terrifying and foreboding. But he ends his warnings with a huge reassurance, "But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays" (Malachi 3:20).

In Paul's second letter to the Christians in Thessalonica, Paul refers to the work that he, Silvanus and Timothy did among the people of the Church there. He points out that they had the right to be fed or paid for their labors, but they chose instead to work for free. This passage is mostly concerned with correcting misconceptions about the day of the Lord and the second coming of Christ.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus refers to the coming destruction of the temple as a sign that old age is dying, and the new age is being birthed: the sign of the coming day of the Lord. The point is not to look for the signs in our world today; the point is not to be terrified but to persevere even under persecution.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the point of today's Gospel is not fatalism of fear because God determines the goal of time, and fear comes not from dread of end times but from dread of not being included in God's goal. At the end, as children of God, we shall be fine, not a hear on our head will be destroyed if we are steadfast in faith and in hope.
