From Fr. Peter's Desk
The Dedication Of The
Lateran Basilica

Dear Parish Family:

We hear in our First Reading from Ezekiel about a vision that the prophet had; a heavenly messenger shows him the renewed Jerusalem temple after its destruction by Babylon and a river of water flowing from the altar of the temple of the sea. Wherever the river goes, life abounds. Living creatures flourish and food is plentiful. The temple's holiness spreads the sanctuary's healing power everywhere the water flows.

When St. Paul writes his first letter to the Christians in Corinth, the early temple is standing but will soon be destroyed again, this time by the Roman Empire. For Paul, God's temple is no longer a building; it is God's people. They are the place God dwells.

In our Gospel reading, Jesus goes to the earthly temple in Jerusalem and drives out the money changers, accusing them of turning his Father's house, into a marketplace. Jesus talks about the temple of his Body, now the temple because Jesus is the place God dwells. The gathered people of God are the Body of Christ on earth and therefore, they are the temple, the place of God's holiness and life-giving power.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, we are reminded today that neither our faith nor our bodies are commodities to be treated with careless disregard. Gathered around the table of the Eucharist, our living bodies are temples wherein dwells the Spirit of God. Treat your body like the temple it is.
