From Fr. Peter’s Desk
Second Sunday of Advent

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from Isaiah, the prophet tells us that the just ruler receives God’s own spirit. The same spirit of knowledge guiding the king helps transform every facet of society and every pocket of creation. Isaiah’s vision of a radically transformed future has inspired people to imagine the change that is possible for our world.

Our Second Reading from St. Paul highlights gifts of endurance and encouragement. The gift of encouragement is not just for oneself but for the strengthening of others. Today’s readings remind us that Scripture can equip us to bear with one another and to lift one another up in difficult times.

John the Baptists’ ministry was a preparation for that of Jesus’ impending one. By preaching repentance and baptizing believers, John prepared people to receive Jesus’ radical proclamation and Spirit-filled ministry. Elsewhere in Scripture, the desert or wilderness is a place of testing and refining that emphasizes God’s miraculous and transformative power.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, John the Baptist calls us to “make straight his paths.” We are called to establish Christ’s kingdom of heaven here on earth, to strive to think in harmony with those in our home, work and parish. Engage in dialogue when problems arise so “that with one accord you may with one voice” arrive at solutions that glorify God.
