MARRIAGES:


Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

**From Fr. Peter’s Desk
The Epiphany of The Lord**

Dear Parish Family:

Israel’s scriptures foretold a messiah; a future anointed leader and liberator descended from Israel’s king David. Psalm 72 proclaims that this king would deliver God’s people and guide them in justice. His rule would be established in Jerusalem, but he would receive honor from peoples throughout the world.

The first chapter of Matthew’s Gospel identifies Jesus as this long-awaited messiah and documents in detail Jesus’ lineage as David’s descendant. In the Gospel reading of today, Matthew quotes from two scriptures, Micah and 2Samule that further illustrate Jesus’ identity and role as Messiah.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Epiphany means a manifestation: something or someone previously unseen and inaccessible becomes visible, tangible and near. Sometimes in a jolt of clarity and insight, what becomes manifest is knowledge. We call that a revelation... Sometimes what, or rather who, becomes visible is God. Let us all pray for our own revelation and feel the presence of our loving God, through His son Jesus.


