MARRIAGES:


Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

THE THEME

In a culture obsessed with strength and success, today’s readings are startling. The qualities and behaviors identified in the Beatitudes look nothing like economic, political or social strength.

Instead, they appear to demonstrate weakness. Paul tells us that God chose the foolish, the weak, the lowly and despised to shame the wise and the strong. Those of us who say we follow Jesus have some soul-searching to do. How do the Beatitudes fit with our professional and life-style commitments? How willing are we to engage in the really hard practices? And what would it mean if we don’t want to?

From Fr. Peter's Desk
4th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from Zephaniah, the prophet foresaw that in the face of judgment and disaster, a humble remnant would find shelter and security. Their humility acknowledged that the power to save was not theirs but God's and that flourishing was not an accomplishment but a gift. Their justice was not to hoard that gift but to share it.

We hear, in our Second Reading from Paul to the Corinthians, that God's continued choice to reverse earthly hierarchies should prompt a reversal of our own valuations. Paul and Sosthenes teach us to relinquish our pride. The wisdom that matters is the folly of a God who became human to redeem human-kind from sin.

In our Gospel, we heard Matthew's version of the Beatitudes. Jesus blesses people whom society has failed to reward. But the rewards promised by Jesus to the meek and merciful, poor and pure, peacemaker and persecuted, both meet and exceed the goals of a just society. Jesus taught His disciples to pray for the kingdom to come "on earth as in heaven".

My brothers and sisters in Christ, it is interesting to note that Pope Francis called the Beatitudes the "Christian's identity card". People recognize us as true followers of Christ by how well we respond to the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount. Do we grieve with those who mourn? Do we try to be a peacemaker? Are we persons of mercy? Jesus' teachings turned conventional wisdom on its head. God's logic runs counter to the logic of our world and is often so hard to follow. Let us pray for the strength needed to be what Jesus has called us all to be, Blessed.
