MARRIAGES:


Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk
First Sunday of Lent

Dear Parish Family:

We hear, in our First Reading from Genesis, that the first humans were enticed by a promise of knowledge that would make them godlike. What's more, promised the serpent, the divine threat of death was only that: a threat. In the short term, the serpent seemed to be correct. They ate the fruit and still they lived.

St. Paul's interpretation of this, however, was their choice brought death to later generations, all of us, opening the gates for sin and death to enter the world. Jesus became human to release humans from sin and death's enduring grip. St. Paul's letter to the Romans reflects on the powerful symmetry between the human God made, Adam, and the human God became, Jesus. Through disobedience, the first introduced a rift between God and humanity; through obedience, the second repaired it.

Jesus too was tempted to claim godlike status: sovereignty over creation, angels, and earthly kingdoms. But Jesus' early mission depended not on claiming power but on self-giving. The answer to temptation for Jesus was worship of God.

My brothers and sisters, in Christ, during lent, our worship has a penitential character. We confess our sins and seek mercy from God. We bring this sorrow to the surface to heal the wounds of sin. Psalm 51, asserts God's power to repair what we have broken, purify our hearts, and return to us the joy of salvation. The Sacrament of Reconciliation heals our spiritual wounds and puts us back on the path to God's kingdom. Now, more than ever, we need to feel that warm embrace of forgiveness in our lives. The door is always open, one need but knock.
