MARRIAGES:


Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk
5th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah, God calls on the people to care for one another's most basic needs: food, shelter and clothing. Care for the bodily needs of every member of the community is a fundamental, shared responsibility. By caring about these bodily needs, people embody the care of the Divine for the whole human person.

The courage to be generous and just in a culture that stokes competition and climbing is rooted in trust in the God whose resources are not limited but limitless. St. Paul proclaims this countercultural Gospel of this same God, urging faith in God's limitless power.

In the time of Jesus, salt was a vital natural resource and commodity that contributed to the economies of Judea and Galilee. Jesus reminds us that People who are the "salt of the earth" are those who have staying power. They are steady, trustworthy, and safe. Their good deeds must be not only for themselves, but for the benefit of others.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, our readings remind us of Jesus' care for the poor and his demand for his followers to do the same. Charity is a light shining in the darkness for those in need and our love for the least in the kingdom glorifies our heavenly father. Let us imitate Jesus by loving those suffering from physical and spiritual poverty. Be a light in the darkness, be "the salt of the earth", all for the glory of God our Father.
