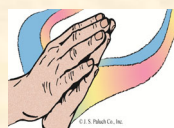

**From Fr. Peter’s Desk
Palm Sunday**

Dear Parish Family:

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most sacred week in the Church’s calendar. Our Palm Sunday Mass includes two Gospel readings. The first narrates Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Our congregation receives palms so that we may reenact this moment of arrival, joyfully hailing Jesus as chosen King, son of David.

The Second Gospel reading dramatizes the sequence of events from Jesus’ betrayal to the sealing of His grave. This passion narrative portrays more than Jesus’ suffering, however. It narrates the resurrection of many who had died. It shows the courageous women who accompanied and remained with Jesus and calls attention to a man who shared His burden and another who cared for and buried His body. It highlights the faith of the centurion and other witnesses and narrates the institution of the Eucharist.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, Palm Sunday calls us to proclaim the name of Jesus above all others and “confess that Jesus Christ is Lord.” The events of this day invite us to reflect on the humility of Jesus and to make His sacrifice a model for our daily life. Jesus put the Father first in love and obedience and put the needs of the world before his own right to freedom and life. By giving up everything that was precious to Him, Jesus gained redemption for the universe!
