## From Fr. Peter's Desk Third Sunday of Lent

Dear Parish Family:

We hear in the First Reading from Exodus that the Israelites' thirst caused them to fear for their lives and the lives of their children. God discerned that they needed more than water. They needed evidence that God was truly with them. God's solution was thus twofold—the miracle of water from the rock and a promise of presence.

In our Second Reading from Paul to the Romans, we are to understand that doubts can be resolved through presence and dialogue. They can also be resolved through action. To those who doubt God's love, St. Paul offers a proof: even though we were sinners, Jesus gave his life for us.

Jesus openly declares that he is the expected Messiah, in our Gospel of today, to the woman of Samaria. He explains that He is the source of living and life-giving water. The woman poses a series of questions and counterarguments during her conversation with Jesus. She is not disrespecting Jesus; she is bringing her doubts to the surface in order to address them through dialogue. Her testimony begins to set the people of Samaria to enter into a similar process, sending them on the path of belief.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, water has a lot to do with today's readings. Moses brings forth water in the desert when the Chosen people feared dying of thirst and Jesus reveals himself as the source of living water, telling the woman at the well that whoever drinks of this water will never thirst again. We all thirst for the life-giving water that only our Lord, "the one called the Christ" can provide and Jesus promises to give us this life-saving water.


