From Fr. Peter’s Desk
Third Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

Peter’s sermon in our First Reading from Acts, interprets Psalm 16 as prophecy about Christ’s death, resurrection and exaltation-foreordained by God for salvation. Equally part of God’s plan is the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, which Peter’s audience now experiences directly.

In our Second Reading, it is emphasized that foreknowledge: the incarnation, death, and resurrection of Christ, was part of God’s plan even before creation. The Passover meal protected the Israelites from death on the eve of their journey to freedom.

Our Gospel reading thematizes the relationship between “the scriptures” (ie., the “Old Testament”) and the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. The repeated motif of “opening” portrays perception of previously hidden truth: Jesus, “opens” the Scriptures to Cleopas and Simon, explaining how earlier scriptures spoke about Him. When He breaks and blesses the bread, their eyes are “opened” and they recognized their risen Lord.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the Mass is an opportunity for the Lord Jesus to walk with us, just as He did with the disciples walking to Emmaus. At Mass, allow your heart to burn with what you hear Him say to you in the readings and in the homily. It is He, the Word made flesh, who speaks.
