THE THEME

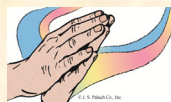

From Fr. Peter's Desk
Fourth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

Our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, echoes the motif of the "call" in the Gospel. The proclamation of the Gospel is a summons to repentance for the forgiveness of sins. This call is issued to all.

Our Second Reading from 1 Peter interprets Jesus' suffering and death in the light of one of the Suffering Servant poems from the book of Isaiah (Isaiah 52: 13-53:12) In this prophetic passage, God's people are described as sheep who have gone astray. God's servant, meanwhile, is "like a lamb led to slaughter". Jesus' atoning death brings the people back to the fold, where they experience the shepherd's protection and provident care once more.

Sheep and shepherd alike enter the fold through the gate. In John's Gospel, Jesus affirms His pivotal role in the relationship between people and God. While other passages identify Jesus as the sacrificial lamb, here Jesus is the shepherd. But Jesus is more; He is also the gate, the means by which humankind enters into the fold, into a life of abundance, safety, and salvation in the provident care of God.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, God's forgiveness is without conditions. He pursues His lost sheep. He is always the Good Shepherd who will never abandon us when we stray. We are called to follow Jesus' example of love and forgiveness. Let us think of how often God has forgiven us and how we might have judged others, not believing they should be forgiven for their sins. We are being called to offer to all the peace of God's mercy.
