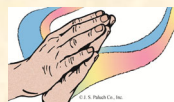

From Fr. Peter's Desk

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

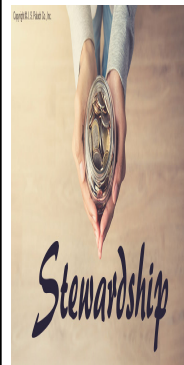
The book of Acts often portrays the gifting and activity of the Spirit that Jesus promised to His followers. Philip's preaching and miracles of healing were possible because of the gift of the Spirit that he received. His Spirit-filled ministry won many converts to the Church.

The reading from 1 Peter states that Jesus was "put to death in the flesh" and "brought to life in the Spirit" This contrast does not separate the parts of the person into flesh and Spirit. All of Jesus died, and all of Jesus rose from the dead. The Spirit is understood, by Peter and expressed in this reading, as an animating force that is necessary for life. It is contrasted with "Flesh" because "flesh" is a hallmark of mortality.

Jesus will ask the father to send "another Advocate," namely the "Spirit of truth" (Jn 14:16) The Greek word for Advocate, sometimes rendered "Paraclete," conveys multiple roles, from helper and intercessor to comforter. In calling Spirit "another" Advocate, Jesus asserts continuity between his role and the Spirit's.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, we're never alone in walking the way of Christ, for He has given us the gift of His Holy Spirit, who comforts us and guides us in every good work. We must learn to lean on the power of the Holy Spirit and know that we are loved beyond measure for following in the footsteps of Christ.
