Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

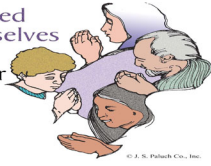
DEVOTION:

From Fr. Peter's Desk Seventh Sunday of Easter

Dear Parish Family:

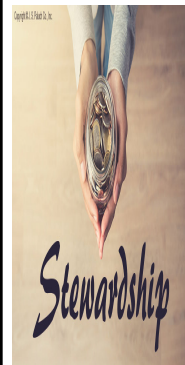
In our First reading, the promise that disciples will receive the Holy Spirit has not yet been fulfilled. This is a time of waiting and preparation, gathering and prayer. The list of those gathered in preparation include eleven, named male disciples, an unspecified number of women, and Jesus' family members.

Our Second reading from 1Peter anticipated the revelation of Christ's glory. For Christians, suffering for the sake of Christ can be a cause for hope and rejoicing. This is because believers who participate in Jesus' suffering will also participate in the joy of his glorification.

In our Gospel reading, Jesus' own time of waiting has come to an end: "the hour has come". This reading contains part of a prayer, sometimes called the "High Priestly Prayer" (Jn 17:1-25), which is the longest prayer spoken by Jesus in the Gospels. In this prayer, His "hour" refers to His return to the father and to the state of glory that characterized His existence "before the world began" (Jn 17:5)

My brothers and sisters in Christ, living as a baptized Christian is not always easy. We are promised eternal life with Jesus, but his comes at the end of our paschal journey. In today's Gospel, Jesus prays for us. This is our guide, we need to pray, to place our trials before Jesus and allow him to be with us, to be in our hearts. We also need to pray to Mother Mary. Pray for strength as we share the sufferings of Christ in our daily lives.
