From Fr. Peter's Desk The Most Holy Trinity

Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading, we hear of Moses' encounter with God on Mt. Sinai. God reveals His name and describes Himself as "merciful and gracious. . . slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." The God of Moses is not the God of wrath that many mistakenly see in the Old Testament but the God of mercy and fidelity.

St. Paul, in our Second Reading, concludes his second Letter to the Corinthians with a blessing we often hear at the beginning of Mass, which names the three divine Persons of the Trinity: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." In this blessing, the apostle summarizes the incomprehensible mystery of God before whom we stand in awe and wonder. The God of Moses, who is merciful and gracious, is a trinity of Persons.

Our Gospel story tells us that Jesus reveals the kindness and fidelity of God when He assures us that God did not send him-the son-into the world to condemn the world but so that the world might be saved through the Son, who reveals the Father to the World.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity is a day to recall how we are invited to know, love, and serve God, who reveals the fullness of love to us and challenges us to be changed by it. Take some time to reflect about how God loves us, and how that should inform our love for God and one another.
