From Fr. Peter's Desk
The Most Holy Body and Blood
of Christ

Dear Parish Family:

We hear, in our First Reading of today, Moses preparing Israel to enter the promised land, reminding the people of all that God did for them during the forty years they wandered in the wilderness. Moses specifically speaks of manna, a food unknown to their ancestors. This bread like food, which Israel called "bread from heaven," foreshadowed the living bread from heaven of which Jesus speaks in today's Gospel.

St. Paul in our second reading, warns the Corinthians, and us, not to take this gift, this manna, for granted as the Israelite's did, eating manna in the wilderness and then falling into idolatry. We must not forget that participation in the Holy Eucharist means that anything that contradicts the Gospel and the Sacrament of the Eucharist is to be dispelled from our lives.

In today's Gospel, Jesus proclaims that He is the living bread that has come down from heaven and whoever eats this bread will live forever. Jesus reminds the crowd that even though their ancestors ate manna during their wilderness sojourn, they died. But whoever eats the bread he gives will live forever.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, the celebration of the Eucharist is the most profound experience we have in our Catholic faith: receiving Jesus, who offered His own flesh for us. This intimacy with Christ requires a most significant responsibility as well, that is the care for the other members of the body-being the hands and feet of Christ to those in need.
