From Fr. Peter's Desk

11th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

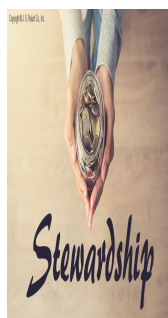
We hear, in our First Reading from Exodus, that having brought Israel out of Egypt, God instructed Moses to tell the people that if they hearken to God's voice and keep the commandments of the covenant, then they will be God's special possession, and God will make them a kingdom of priests, a holy nation. This is why Jesus, aware of the covenant and Promises that God made with Israel, sends His disciples to the people of Israel first and only later to the Gentiles.

In our second reading, St. Paul's letter to the Romans, the apostle describes God's love for us that was manifested in Christ, who did not die for us when we were justified and reconciled to God, but when we were sinners. Paul assures us that now that we are justified and reconciled through Christ's blood, we can be more confident that we will be saved at the moment of God's final judgment.

For the next three weeks, the Gospels will be taken from Jesus' missionary discourse found in Matthew, Chapter 10. This discourse is prefaced by a description of Jesus' compassion for the crowds of people who are like sheep without a shepherd. Accordingly, Jesus summons his twelve disciples and sends them to proclaim, "to the lost sheep of the house of Israel" that "the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today's readings highlight for us what it means to be chosen by God for sacred relationship: whether it is the holy nation of Israel or the twelve apostles of the Gospels, we can look to the many examples of times when God's people have been chosen in love even-and especially -when underserving. As we consider being unworthy yet unconditionally loved, we must be spurred to actions that testify to the greatness of God's compassion!

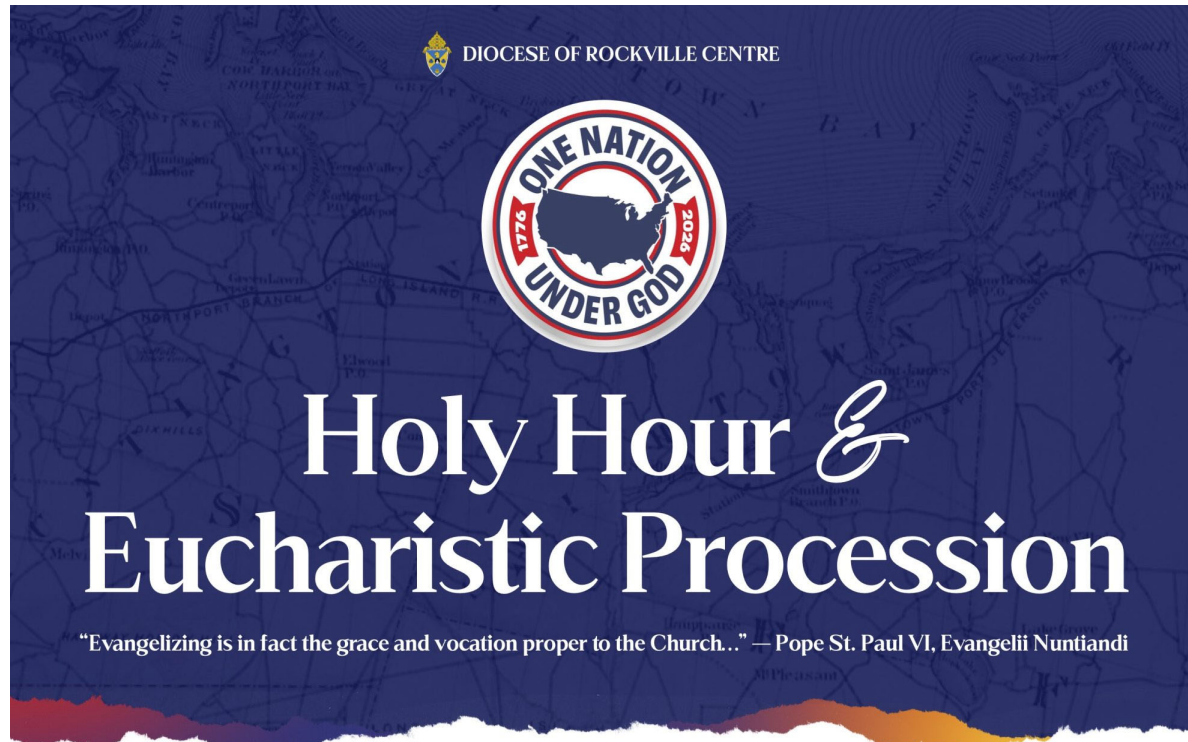
