From Fr. Peter's Desk

12th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

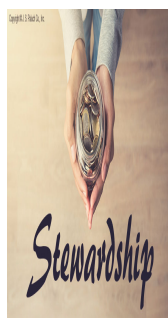
The lament of Jeremiah, in the first reading, provides a background for a deeper understanding of the Gospel. At a particular moment in his life, Jeremiah was assailed by his contemporaries because of the word of God he proclaimed. His confidence that the Lord would vindicate him provides a model for disciples of every age.

St. Paul, in our second reading, draws a contrast between Adam and Christ. Through Adam's transgression, the cosmic powers of sin and death entered the world touching the whole of humanity. Through Christ's obedience, the grace of God overflowed to all, thereby restoring the friendship with God that Adam disrupted. The message of the Kingdom that Jesus' disciples must proclaim is the restoration of our relationship in Christ.

Today's Gospel is a continuation of the missionary discourse Jesus began last week. The emphasis in today's passage is on the confidence that the disciples must have, while on mission, in the face of the opposition they will encounter. We too must have faith and confidence in God's love for us as we face our own daily struggles.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, it can be hard for us to see beyond our own transgressions and failings, as well as those of others. From that mired place, it is difficult to recall how much stronger the grace of God is than any of our faults and failings. The Good News is simple: darkness does not have the final word; only the light of Christ will prevail!
