From Fr. Peter's Desk

13th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:

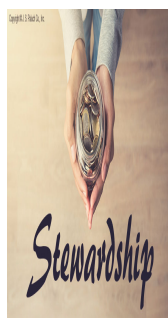
Our First Reading of today, taken from 2Kings, illustrates the rewards about which Jesus speaks in today's Gospel reading. A woman welcomes Elisha and provides a room for him because she recognizes that he is a prophet. Elisha asks what can be done for her and when he learns that she and her husband are childless, he assures her that they will have a son. The responsorial psalm that follows this reading expresses the thanksgiving of this woman and of all who experience God's generosity.

In our Second Reading from Paul to the Romans, the apostle highlights the significance of Christian baptism. Those baptized into Christ are baptized into his death, whereby they die to the power that sin once had over their lives. Dead to the power of sin, they now live in "newness of life," by which Paul means, life in the Spirit.

Our Gospel reading today has two parts. In the first, Jesus lays down the conditions for following Him. In the Second, He promises rewards to those who welcome His disciples. Those who wish to follow Jesus must love Him more than family, take up their cross and be willing to surrender their life for the sake of God's kingdom. Jesus speaks of the rewards that those who welcome his disciples will receive. In welcoming the disciples, they will receive Jesus, and their smallest act of kindness will merit a reward.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today's Gospel can be challenging for us. Nevertheless, it is clear that if we are to live a life of faithfulness and discipleship, there will be a price, and not an easy one to pay. We must learn to reorient priorities and purpose: when we are committed to new life in Christ, as in Paul's letter to the Romans, everything becomes different about how we live today, including the love we have for family, friends and community.
